An Ounce of Prevention: Get Tested if You are Sexually Active

Cases of syphilis, a sexually transmitted disease, have doubled in the last year in Franklin County. A recent spike in cases also led Columbus Public Health to declaring an outbreak.

Sexually active individuals are encouraged to get tested regularly and to recognize the symptoms of syphilis. You or your partner may have it and not know it! <u>Learn</u> more about syphilis and the symptoms here.

NURSES' NOTES | Choosing Care

You have many options when it comes to accessing your healthcare needs. With so many choices for care, it's important to know when to access which option. Here are a few helpful tips to know when choosing where to go:

Primary Care Provider	24/7 Virtual Visits	Convenience Care Clinic	Urgent Care Centers	Emergency Room
Your doctor's office should be your first call for non-emergency matters. Examples: Annual exam Ongoing care for chronic disease management Cold Flu Minor injury Earache Sinus Problem Skin rash Flu shot Fever Pinkeye	Virtual Visits allow you to speak with a doctor from the convenience of your smartphone without an appointment! Just login at MyUHC.com (or call the number on the back of your medical insurance card.) Virtual Visits are an option if: • Your doctor is unavailable • You are traveling • You are considering an emergency room visit for a non-emergency NOTE: Virtual Visits are not intended for any conditions that require an exam or test; nor should it be used for chronic or complex conditions, broken bones, open wounds, etc.	If your doctor is unavailable, a Convenience Care clinic (such as CVS or Minute Clinic) may be an option to help with a minor non-emergency matter. Examples: Flu shots Minor injuries Skin rashes Ear aches	If your doctor is unavailable and you are experiencing a mild non-emergency matter, you may want to consider an urgent care center. Examples: Lower back pain Minor injuries; burns, stitches, sprains Asthma	Emergency rooms are intended for emergency serious health matters. If you or a loved one experience a health emergency, go to your nearest emergency room or call 911! Examples: Chest pain Major burns Shortness of breath Severe asthma attack Severe injuries Kidney stones Life threatening emergencies
